### What is Medical Writing?

"Medical writing is the activity of writing scientific documentation by someone who is a specialized writer (a medical writer) and is generally not one of the scientists or doctors whose research it was."



- Medical writing is about communicating clinical & scientific data & information to a range of audiences in a wide variety of different formats
- Medical writers (MWs)
  combine their knowledge of
  science & their research skills
  with an understanding of
  how to present information
  & pitch it at the right level for
  the intended audience





### **Examples of Medical Writing**

- Journal articles
  - Original research
  - Review articles
  - Editorials, case reports, etc.
- Abstracts
  - Publication in journals
  - Submission to medical meetings
- Posters
  - Presentation at medical meetings

- Medical education materials
  - Monographs

  - Patient education



## Medical Writers - Central To The Team




### Typical Day...

- Working with 5 different pharmaceutical companies
- Writing on 8 different drugs:
  - Diabetes, incontinence, fertility, cardiovascular disease...
- Liaise with clients to ensure information about drug is communicated most effectively
- Work with 'author' to ensure we're writing what they want to say
- Liaise with in-house studio to ensure all art-work contains client's branding and colours
- Dealing with 50-100 emails per day
